
This presentation is a case history of a planned 4-year, \$130 million construction project that was into its tenth year of construction. The client was under a court order to complete the work by a specific date or face multi-million dollar fines. The relationships between the four prime contractors; the Client's operations, project management and construction management teams; and designers had turned toxic. Progress had slowed to a crawl with construction forecasted to continue for another 4 years; at least 2 years later than the court order consent decree date. CH2M HILL was asked to step in and support the client to drive the project to a completion status that satisfied the courts, brought some sense of cooperation amongst all the players, and avoided potential litigation from the environmental community.

The purpose of the presentation is to show the types of recovery activities evaluated and enacted. How respect and cooperation was earned amongst unwilling partners, and how the consent decree date was met. You may be able to apply these lessons learned to your own situations.
