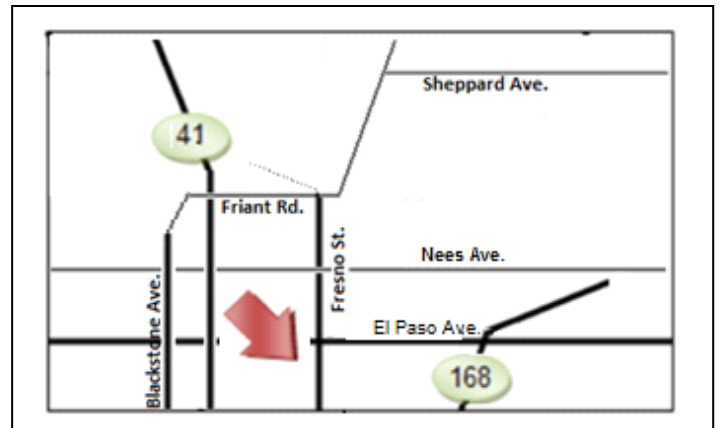

Ken graduated from the University of Missouri (Columbia) with a BS and MS in Civil Engineering, and received an Award for Distinguished Service in Engineering (1988). Ken recently retired after 39 years of project management of large engineering and construction projects in the United States and 20 other countries. He has been a PMI member since 1973 (#843) and a PMP since 1993 (#1840). He has served as the PMI Northern California Chapter Chair, the Co-Project Manager for the 1996 PMI Seminar/Symposium in Boston, PMI Board of Director for three terms, including Chair in 1984 and again in 2004, and Board Member for the PMI Educational Foundation for two terms. Recognized by PMI with several awards including Person of the Year (1985), PMI Fellow (1986), Distinguished Contribution (1997), and the first recipient of the Eric Jenett Award for Project Management Excellence (1999), you can say that Ken basically "bleeds" PMI red.

"The PMI Story"

You won't want to miss next month's presentation to hear Ken explain the widely accepted roles and responsibilities of "The Project Manager" as presented in 1959, which has led to multiple national and international organizations which promote project management.
